Take your time walking the grounds. There's a lovely walk through a wooded area, and you can see one of the few spots on Okinawa where you get a panoramic view that is all land.

Examining the royal home reminded me of walking through the Nakamura House. They also have some sort of snack/show going on there you can purchase separately, but we opted not to. This is considered a sacred site so no food or beverages are allowed, other than those available at the snack/show.

Once you've explored the home, continue walking over some beautiful stone bridges that lead to a small house set out on a tiny island. From there you head back towards the entrance.

With two toddlers in tow it took us about an hour to an hour and a half to go through. We probably would've taken longer had we had more time to relax and examine without the kids.
