My hubby and I were able to have lunch here last week and were very pleasantly surprised. We had heard about the great menu there for dinner, but lunch was a wonderful experience. We entered the restaurant when they opened at 11:30am and were led out to the small balcony area. The ocean view was breathtaking! They have a limited lunch menu, but it's relatively inexpensive. There were about 5 menu items that come in sets which included a [brothy soup](#), [salad](#), [main dish](#), and a non-alcoholic drink. The sets ran from 800 yen to about 1500 yen (Both our orders from the pictures were about 800 yen). The food was delicious and more than enough for the price. There's also an extensive drink menu for both lunch and dinner and they accept yen, cash, and credit card for payment.

Transit Cafe's not too toddler friendly in terms of space, but we plan on bringing our 5 and 3 year-old kids because one table is located next to a tiny rock garden that I think they'll enjoy playing in (I just hope they don't start pelting people down below the balcony with rocks!).
